

NEW APPOINTMENT WINDOWS ARE NOW OPEN.

As of today, the vaccination site at TF South High School (18500 Burnham Ave., Lansing, IL) is opening appointments to all **residents living within District 215 boundaries who are eligible under vaccine phases 1a, 1b, and 1b plus**. This includes residents of Burnham, Calumet City, Lansing, or Lynwood.

District 215 encourages all our families and students who are eligible to schedule an appointment right away using the following link. Note that proof of residency and eligibility will be required and minors under age 18 will need a parent/guardian present. The site administers the Pfizer vaccine and those receiving a first dose at TF South will be scheduled for a second dose at their first dose appointment. Enter through Door N-1 when you arrive for your appointment, and be sure to bring proof of residence and vaccine eligibility.

Please note that this link was released to the public, so be sure to book appointments today to ensure availability. New appointments are released every few days, so if there are no appointments when you check, be sure to check back often.

ELIGIBILITY:

Those in phases 1A, 1B, and 1B+ are eligible to receive the vaccine.

Please note that eligibility for phase 1b+ includes: individuals 16 years and older with Cancer, Chronic Kidney Disease, COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease), Diabetes, Heart Conditions, Immunocompromised from organ transplant, Obesity, Pulmonary Disease (THIS INCLUDES ASTHMA) and Sickle Cell Disease as well as individuals with disabilities, pregnant women and smokers.

Individuals falling into any of the below categories who reside in Lansing, Lynwood, Calumet City, or Burnham are

Phase	Population Group	Examples of individuals in priority population groups
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1A	High risk workers in health care facilities	Physicians, nurses, respiratory technicians, dentists and hygienists, nursing assistants, assisted living facility staff, long-term care facility staff, group home staff, home caregivers, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Doulas, etc.
1A	Residents in Long Term Care (LTC) facilities and Congregate Care Residential Facilities	Adults who live in facilities that provide a variety of services including medical and personal care to persons who are unable to live independently.
1B	Frontline essential workers	First responders, K-12 education workers including teachers, support staff and childcare workers, manufacturing, distribution, and agriculture workers, United States Postal Service workers, correction workers and incarcerated people, public transit workers, grocery store workers, shelter and day care workers.
1B	All Illinois residents age 65 and over	
1B+	All Illinois residents age 16 years and older with comorbidities and underlying conditions, as well as individuals with disabilities	Comorbidities and underlying conditions are as defined by the CDC and include <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cancer ● Chronic Kidney Disease ● COPD (Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease) ● Diabetes ● Heart Conditions ● Immunocompromised from organ transplant ● Obesity ● Pregnancy ● Pulmonary Disease ● Sickle Cell Disease
